Message from our Project Director

The Treasurer has announced a further investment commitment for delivery of the CopperString Project over the next four years.

At a pre-budget announcement in Townsville on Friday the government confirmed an additional \$1.4 billion would be allocated to CopperString over the next four years.

This will be on top of the initial \$1 billion previously allocated for early works such as design, procurement of long-lead equipment, planning and environment approvals and construction of workforce accommodation facilities.

A total budget commitment of \$2.4 billion is welcome news for our people working on the project, enabling the Powerlink project team to advance work on the Eastern Link while Queensland Investment Corporation (QIC) continues their work to assess the project and identify opportunities for private sector investment.

We will continue work to acquire easements, land and approvals for the Eastern Link and prioritise work around Hughenden in the coming financial year, especially construction of a new Flinders Substation.

This work will include preparations for site accommodation across the Eastern Link plus procurement of transformers and tower steel.

Recently, we also attended the Queensland Community Renewables Forum at Hughenden and outlined our work on finalising community legacy infrastructure plans for Richmond and Hughenden, plus ongoing discussions with local councils for legacy projects around Julia Creek, Cloncurry and Mount Isa.

I look forward to providing further updates on project milestones and our work with QIC as soon as possible.

Community Investment and Sponsorship to date

Powerlink is dedicated to providing lasting benefits to communities along the CopperString alignment.

The project will also continue its smaller community and sponsorship investments. Since the beginning of this financial year CopperString has invested more than \$144,600 into community projects and initiatives across the corridor.

This includes support for:

- STEM Changemakers Program providing support for 30 young women to participate in this fantastic program that encourages a career in the STEM fields.
- Clontarf Foundation Parntership- funding towards Powerlink's Queensland-wide partnership agreement
- Sporting and recreational upgrades shade structures for community clubs in Richmond and Maxwelton, equipment purchases for the Hughenden Golf Club, and irrigation for the Richmond Golf Club green
- Youth and education support for St Francis Primary School, Flinders Shire's Study Hub/Country University Centre, and back-to-school packs for Richmond State School students
- Cultural and social events including the Hughenden Country Music Festival and Richmond Rotary's community Christmas event
- Community wellbeing and environment support for Western Queensland Wildlife Rehabilitation Group, Prairie Community Horse Club, and women's workshops in the Flinders Region.

CopperString remains committed to investing in the social fabric of the communities along the project corridor and will continue working closely with local groups to support meaningful initiatives.



Community grants opening soon

Powerlink's 2025 Community Grant Round is scheduled to open in late July, offering up to \$5,000 for one-off community projects. Stay tuned to our website for details on how to apply.

Supporting employment pathways

Powerlink is committed to creating meaningful local and Indigenous participation opportunities on the CopperString project. To support this, we've partnered with Helping Our Mob Everywhere (HOME), an Aboriginal-owned organisation that provides life skills and employment support to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities. HOME is helping job seekers by identifying suitable candidates, delivering targeted training, and facilitating direct employment pathways within the project.

In late 2024, HOME hosted a weekend recruitment session in Townsville to introduce community members to potential project roles. This expression of interest (EOI) event attracted 180 participants.

The recruitment process includes identifying candidates' aspirations and baseline skills, mapping training pathways to ensure job readiness, providing training and support programs, and engaging families to help create a supportive environment.

Participants showed interest in a wide range of careers, including electrical apprenticeships, lineswork, boilermaking, hospitality (chefs, kitchenhands, and cleaning), labouring, maintenance, small business ownership, and environmental roles focused on caring for Country.
