### Charters Towers update

### Project overview

CopperString will deliver affordable, reliable and sustainable energy to North and North West Queensland by connecting the region to the National Electricity Market by 2032 (subject to approvals).

The Eastern Link involves constructing 350 kilometres (km) of 330 kilovolt (kV) transmission line from Reid River near Townsville to Hughenden, supporting the objectives of the Queensland Energy Roadmap. The Western Link includes a \$200 million North West Energy Fund to support local renewable energy generation, battery and microgrids to ensure regional energy reliability improves for communities between Richmond and Mount Isa.

A new Queensland Investment Corporation (QIC)-managed entity will develop, deliver, own, operate and maintain CopperString, with Powerlink continuing to progress Eastern Link approvals and early works during the transition. Both organisations are working together to ensure a smooth transition while progressing design and delivery activities.

# Expression of Interest (EOI) process for Eastern Link

Powerlink recently ran an Expression of Interest (EOI) process to identify sites available for the construction of temporary Workforce Accommodation Facilities (WAFs) required for the CopperString project's Eastern Link, between Hughenden and Townsville.

WAFs are essential for supporting workforce wellbeing, project efficiency, and compliance with planning and environmental approvals. They may include accommodation facilities, health and wellbeing services, laundry facilities, car parking, workshops, and more.

The Eastern Link temporary WAFs are expected to be required for up to five years, including a period of 12 months for construction. The opportunity to nominate a site for the EOI was shared across the region and information sessions were held at the Charters Towers library for interested locals.

The EOI ran for four weeks, closing on 24 October 2025. Powerlink has shortlisted the nominations and has commenced site inspections. Successful applicants will be advised as a part of this final assessment process.
